



Dan Crane was named the Resident Teaching Artist in 2016. Mr. Crane served as an Affiliated Teaching Artist with Shakespeare Theatre Company since 2006. He has also served as a Professorial Lecturer at The George Washington University and Howard University, and an affiliated teaching artist at Folger Shakespeare Library. Shakespeare Theatre Company acting credits include *Romeo and Juliet*, *Richard III*, and *The Beaux Stratagem*. Mr. Crane is also a Company Member with Taffety Punk Theatre Company and received two 2012 Helen Hayes Award nominations for his work in *Cyrano* at Folger Theater and Hub Theatre's *Birds of a Feather*.

Other regional acting credits include work with companies across the United States, including Baltimore Shakespeare Festival, Idaho Shakespeare Festival, PCPA Theaterfest and Portland Center Stage (Oregon) to name a few. In 2013 Mr. Crane directed the Shakespeare Theatre Young Company production of *Romeo & Juliet*, which performed at the Festival International de Companias de Teatro Juveniles in Parla, Spain. He trained at the Pacific Conservatory for the Performing Arts, holds a BFA from Ithaca College and an MFA from the Academy for Classical Acting at The George Washington University.
